Solid Ground owns all Sand Point Housing programs. Operation, management and support services for individual programs are provided by Solid Ground, YouthCare, Friends of Youth, Salvation Army, Veterans Administration, YWCA, Community Psychiatric Clinic and others. Solid Ground and all of our partners are committed to ending homelessness and helping families and individuals gain stability for their future by providing a safe and healthy community for people who would otherwise be homeless.

Brettler Family Place

Brettler Family Place offers 52 permanent housing units for formerly homeless families with children under 18. Families receive onsite supportive case management services, resources and referrals. We offer classes for both children and adults focusing on employment, increasing education, English language skills, parenting and prevention. **Contact: 206.694.6764**

Sand Point Family Housing

Family Housing offers 26 transitional housing units for families with children under 18 who are moving directly from homelessness. Families receive safe, secure housing with case management and support services for up to two years. During their stay, all residents work toward greater self-sufficiency, and adults strive to become employed or participate in educational or job training programs. **Contact: 206.753.4830**

Santos Place

Santos Place offers 42 transitional housing units for single homeless men and women – including veterans – with three ADA-accessible units. Residents receive ongoing case management from referring agencies and a wide array of onsite

support services, and they may stay for up to two years. Santos Place operates on a mutual housing model where residents take part in management and decision-making regarding their housing. (We accept referrals from the Salvation Army, Community Psychiatric Clinic, St. Vincent de Paul and Veterans Administration.) **Contact: 206.753.4820**

Friends of Youth New Ground

New Ground offers group housing for six formerly homeless women, ages 18-21, who are pregnant or parenting their first child. Each mother and baby have their own room and may stay for up to one year. The house has common bathrooms, a kitchen and a basement recreation room with safe play space for infants. New Ground helps young women develop independent living skills to become self-sufficient, productive members of society. **Contact: 206.729.1407**

YouthCare Passages

Passages is a group house for formerly homeless youth ages 18-21 (up to eight residents at a time for up to two-year stays). Youth receive case management to establish independent living plans and must commit to working on a high school diploma or GED during their stay. Passages has 24-hour supervision by a team of highly qualified youth counselors. **Contact: 206.985.8343**

YouthCare Pathways

Pathways is a group house for at-risk, formerly homeless youth ages 15-17 (up to 10 residents at a time for up to two-year stays, or until they turn 18). Youth receive case management to gain independent living skills in a safe, stable home-like environment with 24-hour supervision. They have access to recreational activities, educational services and referrals to a variety of service providers. **Contact: 206.694.4500**

Capital Campaign

In 2011, Solid Ground completed Stage 1 of our *On Solid Ground at Sand Point Capital Campaign* with the construction of Brettler Family Place and the Lowry Community Center – ending homelessness for 52 families, and creating a gathering space for classes, activities and community building. Stage 2 will include 20 additional permanent housing units for families, as well as 34 units for single men and women, including veterans, seniors and people living with disabilities. The Capital Campaign helps fulfill Seattle's ongoing vision to reuse the Sand Point Naval Station, providing permanent housing and support services for hardworking families and individuals overcoming homelessness. **Contact: capitalcampaign@solid-ground.org.**
